Page	Type of Service	Explanation
3	Aboriginal Services & Supports	Providing services to aboriginal services; programs designed & delivered with an aboriginal perspective.
5	Addiction Services & Support	Services for treatment or support to assist citizens experiencing, recovering or having loved ones suffering from addictions.
7	Advocacy & Government Representation	Performing advocacy as a function, either informally (writing letters of support, etc.) or more formally (MLA office, etc.). Also form filling and taxes.
9	Anger Management	Programs, support and services for individuals, families and groups interested in anger management.
10	Basic Needs	Meeting basic needs: clothing, food, meals, income support, collective kitchens & gardens.
12	Community & Economic Development	Addressing macro needs through business, employment, economic or social neighborhood initiatives.
13	Criminal Justice, Legal & Safety	Performing legal services and services related to criminal justice, either informally or more formally. Includes legal aid, community patrol teams, police stations and corrections.
14	Education & Training	Services and programs which provide formal and informal learning , skill or career development, training and education.
18	Employment & Career	Meeting employment needs directly through provisions of employment or indirectly through job search, career planning or work skills development.
19	Family Support & Resource	Meeting the needs of families through counseling, support, information, etc.
23	Family Violence & Bullying	Resources to address family violence and bullying. Includes services for victims or perpetrators as well as public education and prevention initiatives.
25	Health Resources & Services	Providing health services to individuals and families. Includes public health, risk reduction, treatment and assessment services.
25	Immigration, Refugee & Newcomer Services	Providing services and programs to meet the specific needs of immigrants and refugees. Based on cultural , linguistics and ethno cultural needs. Includes ESL.
26	Information and Referral Services	Providing information on community resources.
28	Mental Health Resources	Assessment, treatment and supportive services to meet the needs of those experiencing, recovering from or at risk of mental illness.
29	Recreation & Social Resource	Programs, services or activities which focus on social or recreational needs formally or informally. Includes community leagues and schools.
35	Disability Services	Services and support for people with disabilities.
36	Spiritual & Faith Resource	Formal or informal services and activities designed and delivered to address the spiritual needs of participants

The Act outlines how the police, diversion programs, court system and corrections system will respond to a youth who is accused or found guilty of breaking the law. The Act applies to all youth in Canada who are 12 to 17 years old. This means that the law applies to youth the day they turn 12, and continues to apply until the day they turn 18.

Solicitor General and Public Security is responsible for the administration of custody and community sentences, including providing programs in support of these sentences, and advising the court of incidents of non-compliance with sentences. In addition, staff are involved in cross ministerial initiatives involving youth, addressing educational, mental and physical health, treatment, and housing needs.

Community based programs for young offenders are offered through a network of community corrections offices staffed by probation officers who provide supervision to young offenders.
