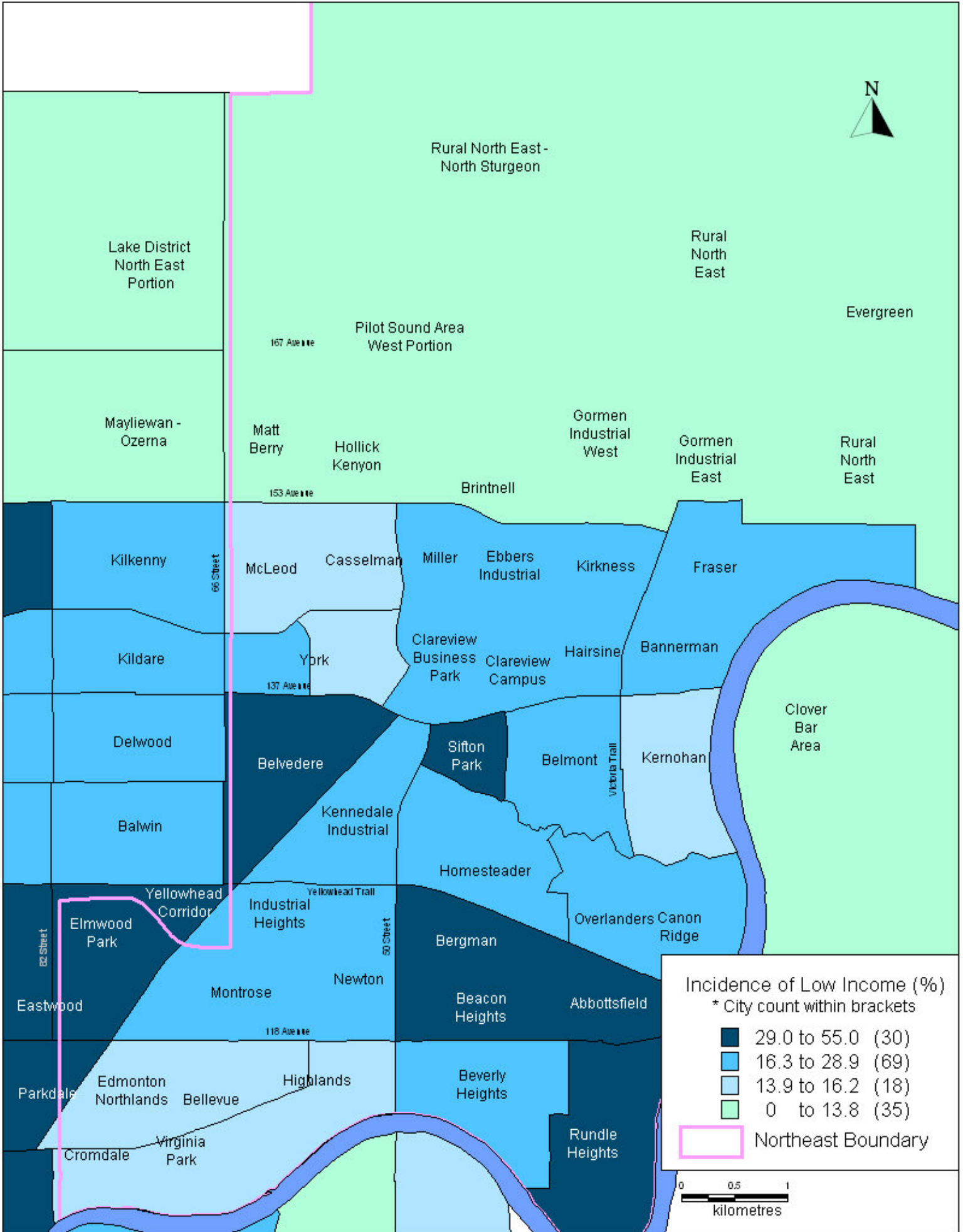


# Northeast Incidence of Low Income
